### Selected Civil Rights Cases:

*Watkins v. State Of Ohio*, (S.D. OH 1996) (State failed to protect juvenile who was stabbed to death in an adult prison by members of a white supremacist group)

*Smith v Leis*, (S.D. OH) (State failed to protect an inmate known to be suicidal; he hung himself in his cell after family members had alerted the authorities that he was contemplating suicide; the warnings were ignored)

*Collins v. City of Cincinnati and University of Cincinnati Hospital*, (S.D. OH 1997) (excessive force and wrongful death action; 15 police officers had surrounded an escaped psychiatric patient and shot him to death when he picked up a brick)

*Kenneth L. Lawson and Associates v. Fraternal Order of Police and Hamilton County Prosecutor, Mike Allen*, (S.D. OH 1998) (defendants had threatened not to plea bargain with any clients of our law firm due to the employment of a newly licensed attorney who previously served a 18 years to life sentence for the felony murder of a police officer; defendants reversed their position the day I filed this lawsuit)

*Carpenter v. City of Cincinnati*, (S.D. OH 1999) (excessive force and wrongful death action on behalf of the family of an unarmed man shot by a police officer in the back of the head during what began as a routine traffic stop)

*Armstrong v City of Cincinnati*, (S.D. OH 2002) (excessive force action involving a mentally challenged suspect who had been wrongfully identified, handcuffed, sprayed with mace, struck by police officers, and kept in custody even after it became apparent they had arrested the wrong person)

*Doe v Village of Woodlawn*, (S.D. OH 2003) (civil rights, excessive force and malicious prosecution complaint involving an elderly Caucasian man who had been maced and beaten by African- American police officers during a traffic stop in mall parking lot; event caught on cruiser video)

*Leisure V. City of Cincinnati*, (S.D. 2003) (wrongful death action by family of an unarmed man shot and killed by a police officer)

***In re Cincinnati Policing***, (S.D. 2002) (class action settlement of racial profiling lawsuit; terms of the settlement included wide-ranging reforms on the use of force, fairness in policing, citizen review of police misconduct, and problem-oriented community policing)

*Jorg v. Cincinnati Black United Front*, 153 Ohio App.3d 258 (1st Dist. 2003) (appellate court affirmed the dismissal of a slander action against a civil rights organization for its criticism of city police following the death of an unarmed African-American man by police chokehold)

#### Selected Criminal Defense Cases:

*Commonwealth of Kentucky v Shawnta Robertson* (1998) (a police officer was killed in an accident while in foot pursuit of the defendant, who had already been taken into custody by another police officer; the case hinged on distinguishing proximate causation from but-for causation)

*State of Ohio v. Melissa J. Kelley*, 1998 Ohio App. LEXIS 4422, (defendant was charged with promoting prostitution for exotic dancing; I tried to introduce evidence that the defendant and her female employees had danced for the local sheriff, deputies, and prosecutors, but the trial judge denied all my motions. On the eve of the trial, a high school classmate of the trial judge contacted me and swore by affidavit that the judge had been at a party where the defendant and her employees had performed; confronted with the affidavit, the judge asked me not to file it. I declined to do so, he refused to recuse himself, and he convicted the defendant. The appeals court reversed the conviction and ordered the defendant released)

*State of Ohio v. Douglas Banks*, (C.P. Hamilton County 1999) (State alleged that a high-level drug dealer had hired two hitmen, including our client, to kill a rival. My client was present during a pre-killing meeting of the trio but in the car when the killing occurred close by; I successfully argued that this level of involvement was not sufficient for a murder conviction)

*State of Ohio v. Krystal White* (C.P. Hamilton County, OH) (16-year-old juvenile was charged with two counts of aggravated vehicular homicide when the car she was driving at an excessive speed crashed into a vehicle driven by Suzanne Daly, a young woman, who was approximately eight months pregnant; the court granted my motion to dismiss the second count because a viable fetus was not a person for the purposes of the statute in question. In response to this case, Ohio's "Daly" Law now includes unborn viable fetuses in their definition of a person.

*State of Ohio v. Charlie Cole* (C.P. Hamilton County) (Defendant was charged with aggravated murder after shooting an unarmed man; the killing had been captured on the accused's home security videotape; elements of the case generated national interest and were covered by the national Court TV)

***State v. Lovelace*** (137 Ohio App.3d 206, 1999) (defendant ran a stop sign while leading police on a high-speed pursuit; a bystander was hit and killed by a pursuing police cruiser; the case hinged on distinguishing proximate causation from but-for causation)

***State of Ohio v. Danny Fortson***, (M.C. Hamilton County, 2000) (NBA player Danny Fortson was arrested and charged with disorderly conduct for cursing an officer; he was acquitted in a jury trial in which I argued that cursing at a police officer is protected speech)

***State v Hardy***, Case No. 00CRB41218 (Hamilton County M.C. 2000) (members of the Ku Klux Klan received a permit from the City of Cincinnati to display a cross and wear their traditional hoods and sheets at a KKK rally at Fountain Square; my client was arrested for disorderly conduct when he attacked a Klansman who repeatedly called him a “nigger”; police officers testified that at roll call before the protest, a city prosecutor told them that Klansmen were allowed to call black men “nigger,” because that was protected speech and not fighting words; I secured an acquittal partly by arguing that my client’s actions demonstrated that the slurs had indeed been fighting words, calculated to move the defendant and others to breach the peace)

***State of Ohio v. Darryl Coad***, (C.P. Hamilton County, 2002) (defendant found not guilty of murder after a jury concluded that he was defending himself when he fired two shots into the back of an unarmed man)

***State v. Germinie Miller***, (2000 Ohio App. LEXIS 1751) (before retaining me as his lawyer, the defendant pled guilty to drug distribution and agreed to serve seven years in prison; I subsequently discovered that the search warrant affidavit, in this case, failed to demonstrate probable cause and that crucial evidence was probably inadmissible; unfortunately, the trial court would not allow my client to withdraw the plea, and imposed the 7-year sentence; but the court of appeals reversed that ruling and ordered the defendant released from custody agreeing with my argument that the search warrant was unconstitutional)

***State Of Ohio v. James Clark***, Case No. B9901717, (Hamilton County C.P.) (defendant and his father were involved in a fistfight with neighbors when the defendant pulled a gun and fired at the attackers, missing them but accidentally killing his father; I successfully defended a charge of felony murder).

***State of Ohio v Reginald Frazier***, Case No. B9301830, (defendant signed for a parcel containing several kilos of cocaine hidden in glass candles with pictures of Jesus on the glass; defendant was arrested for possession with intent to distribute and was facing a possible life sentence in the Federal Penitentiary; I won the trial in federal court

and then secured a dismissal of a state- court indictment just hours before the case was scheduled to be tried before a jury)

*State of Ohio v. Larry A. Byndon*, Case No. B9301982 (high school football star with a full scholarship to the University of Michigan participated in an armed robbery of an “Old Spaghetti Factory” restaurant, locking employees in a walk-in freezer at gunpoint; several weeks after making bail, he engaged in another armed robbery, this time at a Woolworth’s store; after being told by a police officer that he would probably just be put on probation if he confessed and expressed remorse for both crimes, and at the insistence of his father, defendant signed a confession; the court granted my motion to suppress the confession because it had been induced by a promise that could not be kept)

*State of Ohio v. Willie Moton*, Case No. B9402158, (defendant found not guilty of robbery and complicity to commit murder of man wanting to purchase marijuana; others had been directly involved in the crimes, the defendant was the driver of the “getaway” car)

*State of Ohio v. Deion Sanders*, Case No. B9406166, (a professional baseball player, was leaving the stadium on a small motorcycle when a police officer ordered him to use a different exit; according to the police officer, the defendant cursed him and assaulted him by trying to speed off on the motorcycle as the officer was trying to restrain him; I secured an acquittal by a jury on all of the five separate charges. A year later, I won a civil jury trial for Deion after the officer filed a personal injury suit against him)

*State of Ohio v Shadarle Ragan*, Case No. C94CRB11059, (defendant charged and convicted of possession of marijuana despite his claims that a police officer had planted the drugs; later, when applying for promotion to the city’s drug unit, the police officer in question admitted to the interviewing officer that he had planted drugs; I secured a reversal based on the new evidence)
