**(4) ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE**. Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better in all courses counted for this Certificate. Courses must be taken for letter grades unless offered only for Credit/No Credit.

**Note:** With approval, courses taken outside the Law School, including study abroad, may be counted towards the Certificate requirements. Students are encouraged to consult with the Faculty Advisor each semester and should seek approval in advance for courses taken outside the Law School. Certain courses may be counted in more than one Category (e.g., Category 2 or 3) and the credits for a 4-credit SYS paper may be split between Categories 2 and 3. But there can be no double counting of credits.
